We have done that and we have done it well. We started a few project in the previous year and completed their first iteration in this year, I thank Graeme Hickmott for allowing us to start these projects

under his presidency, these being the Odyssea coastal challenge and the Rotary Mental Health awareness forum. Both of these initiatives were successful for the community and the club and were a great learning experience for us.

So what have we achieved this year?, as mentioned the Rotary Mental Health Forum that we ran in conjunction with the Rotary club of Attadale at the Notre Dame Medical theatre in Fremantle. We got coverage in the local press through sponsor backed advertising. There was the Odyssea Coastal challenge which raised nearly \$4,000, most of which went to Red Kite. We are going to do this event again but as I said we have learnt from the first try and are changing the format this year to be a run or walk depending on your fitness level, the committee has been very hard at work and has secured a great deal of sponsorship for the event for November 7th this year. It is anticipated that the event will be even more successful than last year. Another event that the club carried out was give a dam, give a can based on the same concept as Bunbury, for a first up run at this event we collected in excess of 4,000 food items for Wesley Mission and St Pats in Fremantle, Wesley Mission alone felt the value of the food provide to them was in excess of \$7,500 and the whole club got behind this project and helped.

 These events got our activities in the press and got the general public out there noticing Rotary, the Web page that was developed by Paul Chorlton and Adrian Maher was very successful, it even got people from as far away as Leeming involved in the collection and knowing more about what we as a club do. This I believe has generated interest from the public to assist Rotarians and perhaps later joining us in our very worthwhile endeavours.

What else did we do?

- We had a tremendous weekly newsletter the gateway gazette with its many links to both our webpage and other within the Rotary group.
- We were involved in marshalling a number of triathalons which brought valuable experience to us as well as valuable funds to the club.
- We had a tremendous result with the Xmas cakes, the best year ever, because we did what we have always done AND improved on it.
- We did the Xmas tree lights, probably for the last time as the Fremantle City council are now doing that because they saw how much it meant to the community
- For the first time and at very short notice we ran Parking in Fremantle when there were many activities including the visit of the Queen Mary Liner to the port that brought a massive influx of visitors to Fremantle
- We are participating in the Waist disposal challenge, an activity that should bring benefits to us all.
- We had two vocational visits one to AMC at Henderson and the other to the Fremantle men's shed.
- On a lighter note we took part in the Fremantle festival and in the Fremantle Fiesta, we went on a weekend trip to Rottnest, had a fun afternoon at Kim and Vicki's for the AFL Grand Final and hosted a reception for the Rotary Health bike ride around Australia. We had a great

Xmas Function at the Fremantle Yacht club and an excellent International night that started at john Murrays, moved to Kim and Vicki's and finished at Jean Taits place.

- We had a member of this club represent us in France on a wine based GSE
- Workmanship Awards were presented to Kaye Scrimgeour and Denise Burnby of Australia Post, Literacy/Numeracy Awards were presented to Margaret Crummy, Trevanna Cooper and Brother. Kevin Paul. Other awards given by the Club this year were – 4 CBC Student Awards and we had the Four Way Test with 3 participants
